

To prove that man shot in Barn
was Booth

Trial Testimony

- 1) W.H. Garrett statement to F.F.B.I. Nov 14
that the man shot was the same
one at the house the day before -
that he complained about his
leg and hobbled around on some
home made crutches -
Not afterwards he (W.H. Garrett) was
taken to Washington as a witness
and saw pictures of Booth and
with exception of the mustache
was the same man.
- Dr Mudd (Trial Report P.169)
testified that Booth shaved off his
mustache at his house on
Sat. April 15th
- 2) Col Conner's testimony P.92 -
Booth stated "Capt. plane a
cripple before fire was set to barn."
P.93 - Booth's Company, a spur, Bills
of Exchange, Pistols etc found
on body of man shot.
- 3) Corbett - P.94 - one who spoke said
his leg was broken.
- 4) Lieut Doherty - P.95 - man in barn
said he was only guilty person.

I statement of Surgeon-General Barnes P 95 - Stated he examined Booth's body - identified scar on neck.

6) Jett P 91 - Saw Booth next morning at Garrett home in custody of officers.

by himself (trial Report P 169)
stated that Booth showed off his
bullets at his house
that April 15th.

Col Conner's testimony P 43
Booth stated "I kept four or
five cartridges before fire was set to barn."
P 93 - Bullets Conner, a spur, bills
of Exchange, Pistols &c found
in body of Green shirt.

Corbett - P 44 - one who spoke and
his leg was broken.

Frost Doherty - P 95 - man in barn
said he was only guilty pleasure
