LINCOLN MADE PHILA. BOY HAPPY

Paul J. Field, Jr., Tells Realtors
How President Spoke to
Him at Flag-Raising

HOPED HE WOULD BE GOOD

Personal recollections of seeing Abraham Lincoln raise a flag over Independence Hall were given to members of the Philadelphia Real Estate Board at a luncheon yesterday in the board's building, at 13th and Locust streets, by Paul J. Field, Jr., of 742 South 2d street.

Lincoln pulled up his sleeves, said Mr. Field—though he was present in person, his recollections were read from his manuscript by Samuel T. Hall, president of the board. Lincoln tugged on the ropes. When the breeze caught the flag and set it fluttering, the throng burst into wild applause.

Lincoln looked down from his great height to where the boy stood marveling at him.

"Who's boy are you?" he asked.

"Paul Field's boy."

"I hope you'll grow up and be a good man," said the President.

To that happy boyhood recollec-

tion was joined a tragic memory—for Mr. Field told of seeing Lincoln lying in state in Independence Hall after his assassination.

The formal address of yesterday's luncheon was given by Dr. Calvin O.

Althouse—a tribute to the memory of Lincoln and a picture of his personality.

Eleven real estate men from Indianapolis were guests of the board at the luncheon.
