Situated in the City of Enid and Oklahoma territory ~~disclose~~ <sup>declare</sup> that we and each of us know a Gentleman, who registered as a guest at said Hotel on the 3rd day of Dec. 1902 under the name of D. E. George. When on the 13th day of Jany 1903, he committed suicide in said Hotel by taking poison. And that we have this day been shown by Mr. F. L. Bates of Memphis Tenn., a small tin-type picture and a photograph and say that the same are perfect pictures or likeness in each and every feature of the said D. E. George the only difference being that George was older at the time of his death than when the pictures where taken. George declaring on his death bed that he was John Wilkes Booth.
