My object is writing this note is to call your attention to 2 photos which appear in November issue of Harper's, article by Mr Shephid. Notice the outline of the ear in the Booth photo, and the outline in the Bates timtype presumed to have been taken in the seventies and note the great difference.

The writer has a photo of himself taken at the age of 6 months, also another taken recently (I am now approaching middle age). In each photo one ear showing, and I find the shape and outline in the 2 photos is exactly the same. The point I want to bring out is that while other features may change the ears remain the same whether at 8 or 80 years of age and next to finger prints are an almost sure means of identification.

This suggestion is not entirely original with me, but if you consider it of any importance in writing on this interesting subject, you are welcome to use same.
