The manner in which statements are asserted without any basis in fact

is amusingly shown in The Enid Daily Wave's report of January 17, for the government did pay the reward for the capture of Booth, and he was <u>not</u> buried at any time in the Arlington Cemetery at Washington.

The story in the Atlanta Constitution referred to was about the Rev.

James Armstrong, who was thought by many to be John Wilkes Booth. He died in 1891.
