The British Consul at this port communicated to the British Minister at Washington the resolutions of the Englishmen resident here in regard to the assassination of President Lincoln. The resolutions have already been published. Mr. Archibald has received the following from Sir F. Bruce:

WASHINGTON, 20th April, 1805.

Sire: I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of you note of yesterday, transmitting a copy of a dispatch of the 2 inst., from her Britanne Majesty's consul at New-York, in closing copies of resolutions adopted at a meeting of British residents of New-York, for the purpose of expressing the sympathy and condolence upon the occasion of the national bereavement, caused by the assassination of the late President. I received, at the same time, the scaled packet addressed to Mrs. Lincoln, which, in compliance with you request, shall be forwarded to her.

I must bee permission to assure you that the earnest expressions of sympathy and condolence contained in Mr. Archibald' dispatch, and in the resolutions referred to, will be received by the widow and family of the deceased, and by the Government and people of the United States, as an acceptable tribute to his memory, and a truthful manifestation of a large am highly respectable body of her Mighesty's subjects.
