

**Resume of Tuesday's Evidence.**

WASHINGTON, Tuesday, June 13, 1865.

The Court adjourned for two hours, in order to allow a medical survey in the alleged insanity of Payne, as asked for by his counsel.

Dr. James C. Hall of this city testified that he had examined the prisoner Payne, whose mind, he said, seemed to be very inert; witness thought his intellect of a very low order; he could not discover any sign of insanity. A commission was appointed further to examine into Payne's alleged insanity.
