

On Sunday, January 9, 1920 Bob Wilson, The Stage Manager of the Majestic Theatre, Enid, Oklahoma was interviewed with reference to his knowledge of John Walter Robison and David George. He remembered Robison quite well as a correspondent for some dramatic paper. Wilson was stage manager of one of the theatres in 1902-3 during his evening hours and spent the day gathering laundry for one of the local laundries. He insists that there is absolutely no connection between John Walter Robison and D. E. George; that Robison died before George came ~~here~~ ^{to Enid}. He claims he was in George's room in the Grand Avenue Hotel and saw George in the lobby of the same hotel. He says he gathered laundry from George's room and quite often found him in ~~bed~~ ^{bed} as late as nine o'clock in the morning. He says he remembers quite clearly calling at the hotel for George's laundry on the day that he committed suicide and was quite shocked when told about it.
