Dear Mr. Liebold:

Enclosed are two sworn statements which in connection with a copy of a clipping I have from the "Enid Wave," January 13, 1903, which announced the death of D. E. George at 10:30 A.M., the same day proves Brown's statements - Bates pages 266-273 - and also Brown's and Dumont's sworn statements Page 272 - false. George could not have his death announced on the 13th and die at 6:30 A.M. the 14th. I saw the original and complete copy of "The Wave" January 13, 1903.

I am also enclosing two copies of clippings from the Wave, January 16, 1903 and January 23, 1903. Will investigate The Clark story. It may be true. The story January 16th partly agrees with one of 23rd.

Mrs Dumont has remarried a doctor, W.W.D. Akers, Hooker, Okla., but Lee Boyd who lived at hotel says she would not know anything new about it. She did not like the "old man" because he was always drunk and never went near him.

She might know where Brown went to. He was a man 45 or 50 years old at that time, so would be quite an old man now.

Hooker, Okla. is far up in the Northwest part of the state near the Colorado line. I may be compelled to go near there to see Mrs. Harper if she is still at Amarillo, Texas. I will learn tomorrow night at El Reno just where she is.

Oklahoma City is quite near El Reno. Will go over there Friday to find C. M. Clark.

If we can't prove George was Booth, maybe we can prove

him to be George and settle that part of the question.
