Denies Booth Escaped Death After Assassinating Lincoln

Springfield, Ill., March 28. (A.P.)-Five alleged skulls of John Wilkes Booth, assassinator of President Lincoln, are on exhibition in the United States, and 20 "Booths" have died, according to Herbert Wells Fay, custodian of Lincoln's tomb here. Recurring reports that Booth lived 38 years after President Lincoln's death and later committed suicide, are characterized by Mr. Fay as wild.

"Those who wish to make money out of the hoax, or to create cheap notoriety, are the only ones to dispute the historical record of Booth's death in a barn at the Garrett farm," Mr. Fay asserted. "David E. George was only one of 20 different men who have sought to create a furore by claiming to be Booth. Recently while lecturing on Booth's death at the tomb, one of my audience who gave his name as William H. Regan, said he embalmed the body of George, Asked whether he thought it was booth and whether the dead man had any proof of his identity, Regan said he believed not. Nevertheless. George's body was embalmed and shown over the country in a commercial show scheme."
